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The BIG idea of James is the practical proof of how our born-again life will show up in **visible**, **tangible**, **demonstrable** ways in our lives.

Biblical Premise: What do we do as believers when we find ourselves having **great difficulty** in life?

Authorship: All scholars agree the James that penned this letter is the **half-brother** of the Lord Jesus.

Audience: Jewish Christians who have been scattered across the **empire**.

Why?

- They are in a hostile culture not friendly to Christ followers.
- This is a **play book** for new believers in a hostile land.
- Count any trials in your life as a joy.

Why Would I Do That?

 Because you know this is a test of faith that will produce good results.

2 Actions For Our Lives When We Face Trials

- 1. Hold on to the fact that in your circumstances **Jesus is** working.
 - There is a purpose in the pain.
 - Joy and happiness are not the same thing.

"Joy is found in Jesus and its less an emotion and more a settledness in your soul."

Defining Terms

Joy: supernatural delight in the **Lord Jesus** and His **people**.

In the confusion of our trials, you need to be able to say...

- Jesus loves me.
- He is **Sovereign**.
- He is in **control**.
- He is a good God who is for me.

Principle of life...

• If I don't cooperate with what the Lord is trying to teach me, I might have to **retake** the trial.

The invitation...

2. Hold on to the invitation that if you don't know what to do in a trial, you have been invited to ask God for **wisdom**.

But understand...

 Asking with faith and doubting means you want His help, but you don't really want to do it His way.
